Individuals may also attend Assembly as Special Invitees upon invitation from the President of the Assembly. Special Invitees will be allowed to intervene in the proceedings only with the permission of the President, but without having the right to vote. Special invitees may have a delegation comprising not more than three members."

- 2. Unique User ID and password to join the digital platform.

General guidelines on Registration:

- 1. Delegates are requested to register no later than **18 October 2021** (unless extended), to facilitate smooth coordination for compilation of the list of the delegates and sharing of the respective links as per the categories to join the platform.
- 2. Prior online registration is mandatory to ensure standard cyber security procedures and to facilitate smooth and hassle-free participation.
- **3.** To ensure smooth registration, the delegates are requested to submit the completed form including duly filled Credential Form and Accreditation Form by **18 October 2021.**
 - A. **Credentials Form** (by the countries who have signed and ratified the ISA Framework Agreement and have deposited the instrument of Ratification with the depositary)
