- All visitors to India are required to possess a valid passport with validity of at least 6 (six) months from the date of entry into Indian territory. For participants from countries with visa requirements, it is recommended that they obtain a valid visa (Conference Visa) before arrival. It is advisable to submit visa applications at the earliest to the relevant Indian Embassy / Consulate. Visa will be issued 'gratis'.
