#### **TERMS OF REFERENCE**

#### 1.Context

Fiji's Nationally Determined Contributions (NDC) aims to reduce Carbon Dioxide (CO2) emissions by 30% in comparison to the business as usual (BAU) scenario from 2020 - 2030. The mitigation actions and financing need to achieve the NDC commitments are specified in the NDC Implementation Roadmap (2017-2030) and the NDC Investment Plan. Recently, Fiji passed its Climate Change Act which addresses the links between all sectors of its economy and climate change and provides a pathway for Fiji to mitigate Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions and achieve its enhanced NDC target and goal of being net-zero by 2050.

Fiji currently generates roughly 60% of its electricity from renewable sources. Fiji's National Development Plan (NDP) and Nationally Determined Contributions (NDC) both set targets to generate almost 100% of all electricity from renewable energy resources by around 2030. Both documents call for prioritizing investments for decarbonizing the electricity sector, including, scaling up rural mini-grids and solar systems.

The Agriculture Sector is a significant contributor to GHG emissions — directly through agricultural practices and indirectly by consuming GHG emitting electricity largely for irrigation. The Climate Change and International Cooperation Division (CCICD) of the Ministry of Economy have identified solar-powered pumps for agriculture that can help in decarbonizing the Agriculture Sector and help meet Fiji's NDC commitments. The adoption of solar-powered pumps (SWP) can replace carbon-intensive fossil fuel, thereby reducing carbon emission drastically in the agriculture sector. Besides, the adoption of SWP also offers additional socio-economic benefits such as reducing the cost of electricity for irrigation and possibly increasing farm production thereby increasing farmers' income, reducing the electricity subsidy burden of the state, mitigating electricity access challenges in rural areas, and is used in other activities, including drinking water treatment, cold storage, and agro-processing industries. However, there are challenges associated with the adoption of SWP in the agriculture sector, including access to finance, lack of distribution channel, limited awareness of benefits of adoption of SWP, and limited capacity for operation and maintenance of the system.

To effectively address these challenges and ensure the successful implementation of solar-powered pumps in the agriculture sector, the establishment of a Technical Steering Committee is proposed. The Technical Steering Committee will be composed of experts and stakeholders from relevant government agencies, renewable energy specialists, water resource management professionals, community representatives, non-governmental organizations, development partners, and financial experts. This committee will contribute to overseeing and advising on the planning, implementation, and monitoring of solar-powered pump projects in Fiji. Their collective expertise and collaboration will ensure the selection of appropriate sites based on defined criteria, proper technical assessments, and effective decision-making to align the solar-powered pump initiatives with Fiji's NDC commitments and the goal of achieving a sustainable and climate-resilient agriculture sector.

## 2.Activity

The International Solar Alliance (ISA) Secretariat intends to conduct a feasibility study to identify and assess the needs and benefits of solar water pumps in Fiji with an objective to deploy SWPs in commercial sugar cane and rice farming operations. The feasibility study will help in building a business case for implementing solar pumps on a national scale. In the first stage, the ISA Secretariat invites organizations to conduct a technical study in a few sites; these sites are

- 1. Vanua Levu: Wainikoro & Daku (Sugar & Rice) and Dreketi (Rice)
- 2. Viti Levu: Tavua (Sugar) and Varoko Ba (Rice & Sugar)

A technical steering committee will be formed; the committee will be comprised of officials and experts from the ISA Secretariat, Sugar Research Institute of Fiji, Sugar Cane Growers Fund, Sugar Cane Growers Council, Fiji Sugar Corporation, Ministry of Sugar Industry (MoSI), Ministry of Economy, Ministry of Waterways/Environment, Department of Energy, Mineral Resource Department (Ministry of Land and Mineral Resource), and Ministry of Agriculture. They will be consulted in due course of the study.

# 3.Scope of Work

Under the direct supervision of the Head of Department of Energy at Ministry of Infrastructure, Transport and Meteorological Services, the following activities are proposed:

- I. Conduct a study on solar radiation patterns in the selected project sites based on secondary data and prepare a report covering the monthly and annual summary of solar radiation.
- II. Prepare criteria for the selection of sites to install solar powered pumps in consultation with *the technical steering committee* for solar powered pumps
- III. Survey the crop schedule and cultivation procedure in the sites to understand current irrigation patterns, expenditure on irrigation and whether the pumps will be utilized throughout the year
- IV. Collect baseline data on agricultural, environmental, social and economic aspects for the sites
- V. Based on the information collected from the field visits, the consultant/firm will prepare initial system design and technical specifications suitable for the sites taking into consideration the possibility of installing off and on grid systems
- VI. Conduct a study of Hydrological data of the area for suitability of solar pumps for functionality for over twenty years and also right sizing of the solar pumps.

The feasibility report should help in estimating irrigation potential of SWPs at the sites, cost of installation of SWPs, operation, and maintenance, and assess ecological impacts of installations.

## 4. Specific deliverables

It should be noted that each output must be signed off by the ISA Secretariat and the Department of Energy, who will provide indication to proceed with works on each phase of the study. All management arrangements will be agreed during kick off meetings at the start of the inception phase. The specific deliverables are as follows:

- I. Inception report encompassing the methodology to be applied by the consultant during the execution of the project and a tentative action plan of the activities to be carried out throughout the period with specific deadlines.
- II. Present a technical feasibility report for each of the sites visited and studied.
- III. Final report detailing the suitability of solar powered pumps for the sites including the types/capacities of solar pumping system, civil works/construction needed for smooth functioning of the system and recommendations for the most suitable plan of deploying solar powered pumps.
- IV. Suggest transitional plan of shifting the diesel-based irrigation to solar operated irrigation, optimisation of the usage of solar pumping systems, efficient practice of water management for irrigation process, need of water storage for non-sunny hours (wherever required) and utilization of solar power during non-irrigation periods at the above sites.
- V. Suggest capacity building of all stakeholders for trouble free operation and maintenance of the Solar Pumping Systems.

## 5. Estimated cost and Payment schedule

The estimated cost for the study is 10,000 USD.

The indicative timeframe of the assignment is for 2 months,
